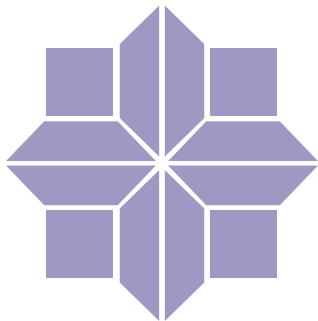

Observing a Holy Lent

Lent began on Ash Wednesday, February 22 and will go until Easter Sunday, April 9, 2023

Lent is a period of 40 days (not including Sundays) before Easter. The period of 40 days reminds us of the 40 days that Jesus was sent into the desert by the Spirit and faced his own temptation (Matthew 4:1-11). We also face temptations in our life. Lent is a time when we reflect on who we are, our own temptations and our need for the forgiveness that is ours through Christ's death on the cross.

It is common for Christians to observe Lent by giving something up, sacrificing to remind them of Jesus' ultimate sacrifice for us. Instead of giving something up, some Christians add something to their lives during Lent.

Below are some suggestions that are adapted from Upper Room.

- Try an electronic fast. Give up TV, Facebook, texting, tweeting, e-mail and all things electronic for one day every week. (Or everyday of Lent!) Use the time to read or pray. Have you seen the ad on TV from US Cellular called Take 5? The ad suggests that we all Take 5 from our electronic devices, 5 minutes, 5 hours or 5 days. That would be a great Lenten practice!

- Start a prayer rhythm. Each day of Lent pray for someone. Pray for that person all day. God will show you who to pray for each day if you ask.
- Forgive someone who doesn't deserve it (maybe even yourself.)
- Give up soft drinks, fast food, tea or coffee, some food as a way to grow closer to God. Give the money you save to help folks in need.
- Create a daily quiet time. Spend 10 minutes a day in silence and prayer. Read a daily devotional for the season of Lent. See how it can help you add spiritual practice to your daily life beyond Lent.
- Cultivate a life of gratitude. Write someone a thank you letter each week and be aware of how many people have helped you along the way.
- Pray for others you see as you walk to and from classes or drive to and from work.

Lent is about love and sacrifice, both shown to us by Jesus.

How will you show your love for others? How will you sacrifice as a reminder of Christ's sacrifice for you?

May you find a way to observe a Holy Lent this year.

Striking a New Chord

If you've stepped into the Sanctuary recently, you would have noticed that the church

has acquired a baby grand piano. This beautiful addition to our church was made possible by memorial funding. A special thanks goes to the families who have made this possible and to the Memorial Committee for utilizing the funding in this capacity.

Since becoming music director in 2019, it has been my goal to continue our rich history of providing wonderful music for the glory of the Lord. When the Covid 19 pandemic hit, our plans for life, church and the music department had to change. Life as we knew it was turned upside down seemingly overnight. During the pandemic a digital piano was moved into the Sanctuary to easily record and stream music. It was never our intention to keep a digital piano in the Sanctuary. It is our hope that this new

instrument continues our goal of enhancing our worship experience for many years to come.

Oh Come, let us sing to the Lord!

Rehearsals for the Chancel Choir have resumed, and we need volunteers to step up and lift their voice. In Psalm 95 we are told "Oh come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation! Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to Him with songs of praise!" Did you know, the bible mentions music more than 100 times? It also mentions singing more than 60 times. Without volunteers our choir, like many other ministries of our church, cannot function. The small but mighty Chancel Choir needs your help! For several months, many people have told me they cannot sing, I have always believed, that it does not matter to the Lord. What matters is service! Every time the choir sings in church, I'm told, "I really enjoyed that," My response almost always is "join us". You do not have to commit to every week, sing when you can. You do not need to know how to read music, we will help you find your voice! Rehearsals are held every Wednesday at 7:30pm in the Sanctuary. Come and sing to the Lord!

United Women in Faith Update

The first unit meeting of the year for United Women in Faith was held on Feb 9th at 1:00. The program speaker was social worker, Miranda Kracke, who spoke about her work at the Child Protection Center in Waterloo. The center is one of six across the state that provides service and support for children who are victims or witness abuse. The office in Waterloo serves 27 counties in Iowa. Sobering statistics include that 1 in 10 children is sexually abused by the time they are 18 years old but only 5-13% tell anyone. These incidents occur proportionately across races and economic backgrounds. Miranda's work focuses on assisting the Iowa Department of Health and Human Services and law enforcement by doing forensic interviews with the children in a sensitive and safe environment. Representatives from both organizations observe the interviews from another room to assure the child only has to tell of the incident once. The children and families are then followed by family advocates who provide further ongoing support.

The Child Protection Center is supported by state funding, local grants, and individual donations. They have seen a 27% increase in the number of referrals interviewing 583 children last year. Some of the increase may be related to increased awareness of the program but Miranda also believes the impact of Covid shut down may have had a negative impact. She recommends teaching children "body safety" and refer any suspected abuse to authorities for investigation.

Maxine Kehret also lead the prayer of self-denial and reviewed the Charter for racial justice.

Winter Weather Policies

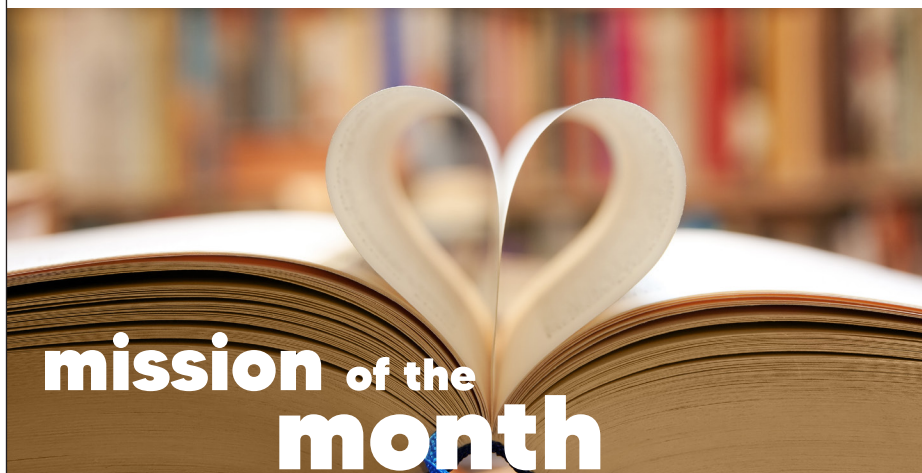
WORSHIP

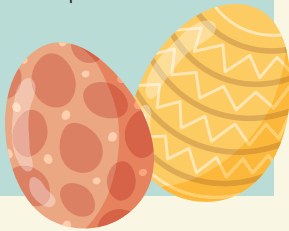

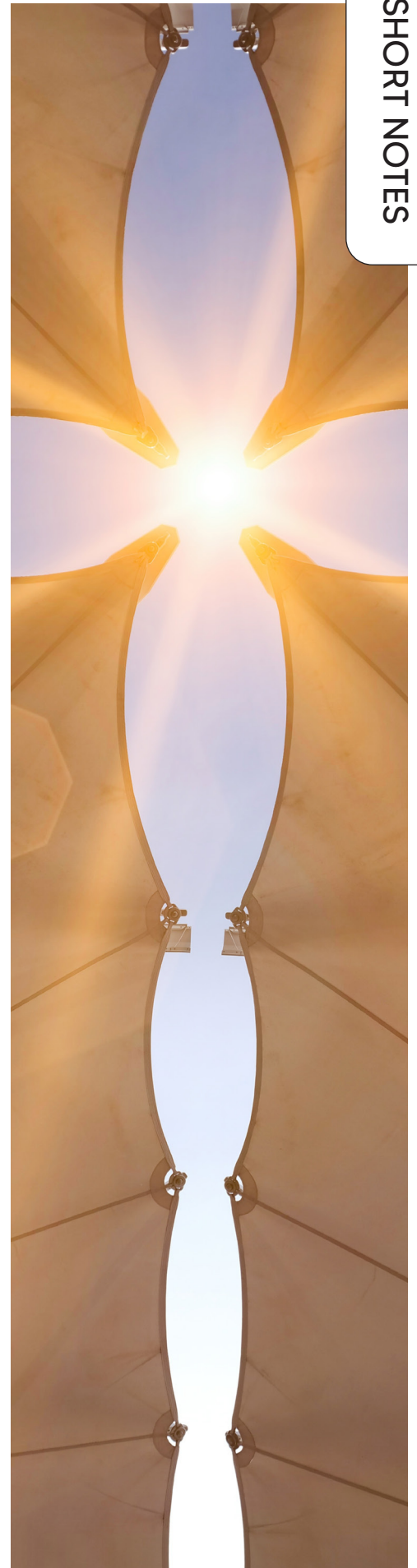

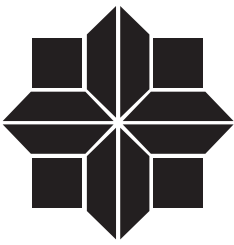
Easter lilies
